Blarney Castle

Clonmacnoise - Connemara

Total driving distance & time: 310 kilometres – 4 hours 10 minutes, excluding stops

Switch on Paddy the Pocket Pilot app and start your expertly planned self-drive tour, leaving Dublin for the beauty and surroundings of the 6thcentury monastery at Clonmacnoise, located on the banks of the River Shannon. The monastery was a centre of excellence for learning and scholars created the finest of Celtic art and illuminated manuscripts over 600 years.

With a whetted appetite, you will cross the country into County Galway. Your next stop is Kylemore Abbey in the heart of Connemara. The rugged landscape of Connemara come hail rain or shine is guaranteed to take your breath away. Spend time roaming the abbey and Victorian walled garden on this 1000-acre estate overlooking Kylemore Lake and the majestic Connemara National Park.

At the end of a busy day, stay in Clifden surrounded by the Twelve Bens mountain range. Discover some great bars, restaurants, and nightly music and have a chat with the locals over a pint of the Black Stuff!

We have added the option of staying in an exquisite castle so you can embrace your inner Prince(ss)!



The Aran Islands

Total driving distance & time: 100 kilometres - 1 hour 40 minutes, excluding stops

After a short drive cross country to Rossaveal Pier on Galway bay, board the ferry to the Aran Islands. You'll land on rugged Inishmore, the largest of the three Aran Islands. Explore the Island by bicycle or by special request jaunting cart all pre-booked and arranged for you by the team at Overland.

The route will take in the stone fort of Dún Aonghasa, which lies 100m over the ocean before making your way back to the mainland. While you are there you might pick up a few words of "Gaelic" from the locals and maybe treat yourself to an original Aran Sweater!

Your departure from Rossaveal is the start of our Galway adventure. Hug the coastline all the way into bustling bohemian Galway. Expect a great atmosphere, entertaining street performers and plenty of craic in this much celebrated town.

Galway - The Cliffs Of Moher

Total driving distance & time: 90 kilometres – 1 hour 45 minutes, excluding stops

Galway is a city that has its Medieval history at its very heart. Our local guide will take you down the narrow streets where you can duck in and out of brightly coloured shops.

Try on Claddagh Rings and Galway Shawls and pass through The Spanish Arch to take in the famous Claddagh fishing village.

This day just keeps on giving. You will now travel southwest towards The Burren National Park and the jaw-dropping Cliffs of Moher. On this adventure, you will visit Corcomroe Abbey, a 13th-century Cistercian Monastery and the 16th-century Dunguaire Castle in Kinvara.

The cliffs experience will take you by foot across its stunning natural features with the powerful Atlantic Ocean waves crashing in below. The cliffs are one of the most spectacular natural features in Ireland and are sure to leave you lost for words. The evening is spent in the hometown of traditional Irish music – Doolin.

Doolin To Dingle

Total driving distance & time: 240 kilometres 3 hours 30 minutes, excluding stops

Before travelling deep into the wilds of Donegal, let one of our favourite tour guides lead you through the streets of Derry to help you understand the struggles of our past and the long road it has taken to the current peaceful times we now enjoy in Northern Ireland.

On route to Glenveagh National Park, treat yourself to a pit stop at Grianan of Alleach, a 6th-century hillfort built on top of the 244-meterhigh Greenan Mountain at Inishowen, County Donegal.

Perched in the Donegal mountains, Glenveagh Castle, gardens and parks have so much to offer. The 16,000 hectares of the park include the Derryveagh mountains and the Poisoned Glen which boasts hills and trails to follow for the afternoon. There are challenging routes for you to enjoy and more relaxed trails to take at your leisure. Why not try the cycle route?

An hour away you will settle in for the evening in the picturesque village of Ardara.

The Dingle Peninsula

Total driving distance & time: 50 kilometres – 2 hours 30 minutes, excluding stops

Today your morning begins exploring caves and inlets on Dingle Bay by kayak and meet county Kerry's biggest celebrity – Fungie the Dolphin.

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If kayaking isn't your thing you can take a moderate-paced hike up Mount Brandon where you will be rewarded with 360-degree panoramic views of Dingle Bay and Castle Gregory.

Perhaps you just want to stroll around this colourful village full of cute craft shops and cafes. Take today at your own pace. It's your holiday – Do it your way.

This afternoon, jump in the car and take an impressive trip along one of Ireland's most scenic roads – The Slea Head Drive. You spend another night in the buzzing town of Dingle – relax and enjoy.

Sites On The Ring Of Kerry

Total driving distance & time: 200 kilometres – 3 hours 30 minutes, excluding stops

Say a fond farewell to Dingle and journey towards the Ring of Kerry. The first stop takes you to Killarney.

The Ring of Kerry is the very definition of the word scenic and you will discover many hidden gems including Moll's Gap, Torc Waterfall and Ross Castle in Killarney National Park.

We will arrange a guided tour of Ross Castle where you will learn what life was really like behind the stone walls.

Stop for some shopping and lunch in the beautiful heritage town of Kenmare. For your last night on tour, we are excited to send you to coastal Kinsale which is famed for its culinary culture, delivered by its many award-winning restaurants.

The town also has a great tradition of poetry, silver, gold and glassware manufacturing which can be seen throughout its local shops and galleries – boasting local talented artists.



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Cork - Kiss The Blarney Stone

Total driving distance & time: 320 kilometres – 3 hours 30 minutes, excluding stops

Wake up refreshed and ready to be taken on a guided walking tour through the narrow streets of Kinsale with one of Ireland's greatest guides, Barry.

Your self-drive App Paddy will lead you on to Blarney because you simply cannot leave Cork without visiting Blarney Castle and Gardens and giving the Blarney Stone a big fat kiss!

Your final stop before driving back to Dublin is the Rock of Cashel. The Rock of Cashel is over 1000 years old and you will get to see its medieval round tower, chapel, cathedral and castle. A fantastic end to your trip.

It is now time to turn off your engine, dry your tears and to sit back and soak up all that you have experienced over the last 7 days. If you have any time left before leaving the Emerald Isle we will give you plenty of amazing recommendations for things to do, eat and entertain you in Dublin's fair city.
