

Galway & the West

Galway is the cultural heart of Ireland and a must-visit on any trip along the Wild Atlantic Way. The city hums with creativity, from its medieval streets and bustling festivals to its thriving food and arts scenes. It's a place that perfectly balances tradition and modern Irish life.

Kerry & Cork

Kerry is home to the world-famous Ring of Kerry and the Dingle Peninsula, where emerald-green hills tumble toward the ocean and winding roads reveal breathtaking views at every turn. The Skellig Islands, just off the coast, add a touch of ancient mystery to the region.

Cork, Ireland's second-largest city, is known for its charm and character. It's a city with a distinctly local feel – full of artisan markets, riverfront cafes, and friendly conversation. Beyond the city, West Cork offers some of the most beautiful coastal drives in Ireland, with colorful villages like Kinsale and Clonakilty providing perfect stops for seafood and scenery.



The Ancient East

Step into Ireland's storybook past in the Ancient East – a region where every hill, ruin, and riverside seems to whisper tales of bygone eras. Here you'll find prehistoric tombs older than the pyramids, grand Norman castles, and monastic ruins hidden in misty valleys. Wander through Kilkenny's medieval streets, discover Viking heritage in Waterford, and trace the footsteps of saints and scholars in Ireland's oldest landscapes. This region feels timeless – the kind of place where history doesn't just sit behind glass; it surrounds you.





Northern Ireland and The Causeway Coastal Route

Few drives in the world rival Northern Ireland's Causeway Coastal Route. It's a breathtaking road winding between cliffs, beaches, and charming seaside villages. Every turn brings a new view, from the hexagonal stones of the Giant's Causeway to the dizzying heights of the Carrick-a-Rede rope bridge. Stop to explore Dunluce Castle, a dramatic ruin perched on the edge of a cliff, or detour inland to the Glens of Antrim for quiet forest walks and waterfalls.

In Belfast, discover a city transformed. Once the heart of shipbuilding, Northern Ireland's capital is now a hub of creativity and culture. Visit Titanic Belfast, explore the murals that tell the city's turbulent story, and enjoy some of the best food and live music anywhere on our island.

Best Times to Visit Ireland in 2026

Ireland is beautiful year-round, but the experience changes with the seasons. Whether you're chasing long summer evenings or peaceful spring landscapes, there's always something to look forward to. Here's what each season brings – and why 2026 is the perfect time to start planning your trip.

Spring in Ireland (Mar to May)

Spring in Ireland feels full of promise. The countryside bursts into color with wildflowers, fresh green fields, and newborn lambs dotting the hillsides. April, in particular, is a wonderful month to visit. It's warm enough for outdoor adventures and quiet enough to enjoy popular sights before the summer buzz begins. It's a favorite time of year for hiking, cycling, and exploring local villages.

- Average temperatures:
 54 to 60°F (12 to 16°C)
- Daylight: Around 11 to 15 hours

Summer in Ireland (Jun to Aug)

Summer is when Ireland truly shines. Long daylight hours mean more time to explore (up to 17 hours of light in June and early July), and every town and village seems to come alive. July and August are peak months for festivals, music sessions, and outdoor adventures. It's the best time to experience Ireland's famous warmth and energy, from kayaking on Dingle Bay to joining a local celebration on the Wild Atlantic Way.

- Average temperatures:
 64 to 70°F (18 to 21°C)
- Daylight: Up to 17 hours in June

Autumn in Ireland (Sep to Oct)

Autumn wraps Ireland in soft, golden light. It's harvest season, so you'll find food and drink festivals, cozy pubs serving hearty local fare, and plenty of scenic drives through colorful countryside. It's still warm enough to hike, golf, or cycle, and the slower pace of travel makes it a great time to connect with locals.

- Average temperatures:
 57 to 63°F (14 to 17°C)
- Daylight: 10 to 13 hours

Winter in Ireland (Nov to Feb)

Ireland's winter has its own kind of charm. Towns glow with festive lights, Christmas markets fill the streets, and castle hotels feel extra cozy with open fires and hearty meals. It's a peaceful time for travelers looking for a relaxed and authentic escape.

- Average temperatures:
 46 to 50°F (8 to 10°C)
- Daylight: 7 to 9 hours

Practical Travel Tips for Ireland

Packing

Ireland's weather is famously changeable. Bring layers, a waterproof jacket, and comfortable walking shoes. Even in summer, evenings can be cool, so a warm jumper (sweater) is handy. Our blog What to Pack on a Trip to Ireland is filled with even more valuable local insights!

Driving

If you're planning a self-drive trip, remember that in Ireland we drive on the left. Roads in rural areas can be narrow and winding, but that's part of the charm. Allow more time than you think between stops – you'll want to pull over for photo breaks often!

Money & Customs

The euro is used in the Republic of Ireland, while Northern Ireland uses the British pound. Credit cards are widely accepted. Tipping is appreciated but not obligatory; around 10% in restaurants is typical. In taxis, you can just say "keep the change" to the driver, and, for guided tours, the industry standard for tipping outstanding service is between €15 and €20 per day. Of course, this is totally up to the guest!

In pubs, just be sure to buy your round at the bar! <u>Our Guide to Tipping in Ireland</u> is a great resource on this topic.
